**MEETING OPENED:**

The East Fishkill Board of Fire Commissioners held their regular board meeting at district headquarters. Chairman McNamara called the meeting to order at 8:05 P.M.

**MEMBERS PRESENT:**

Those members present were: Chairman McNamara, Vice-Chairman Shultis, and Commissioner Post. Commissioner Ehrhart and Commissioner Stuart were excused.

All motions were unanimous, unless otherwise stated.

**MOMENT OF SILENCE:** For all fallen brothers and sisters in the military, police, and fire service.

**SECRETARY'S REPORT:**

The minutes of the December 26<sup>th</sup> meeting and the January 14<sup>th</sup> meeting were accepted on a motion by Commissioner Post and seconded by Vice-Chairman Shultis. Motion carried.

**TREASURER'S REPORT:**

The Treasurer's Reports for December, 2018 and the Fiscal Year 2018 were accepted on a motion by Vice-Chairman Shultis and seconded by Commissioner Post. Motion carried.

**BILLS PAYABLE:**

Commissioner Post made a motion that the bills payable from the General Fund totaling \$120,324.04 and \$579,406.00 from the Reserve Fund for Major Equipment, numbered 1 through 123 be approved. Seconded by Commissioner Stuart and carried.

Members dropped: Shane Gallo, David McIntyre, Daniel O'Connor, Eileen Baez, Maggie Hope, Jennifer Martinez, Justine Schmidt, Aram Mergian.

On a motion by Commissioner Post and seconded by Vice-Chairman Shultis, the Medicine in Bad Places class for 3/3 & 3/30/19 at a cost of \$5,000 was approved.

Vice-Chairman Shultis made a motion to terminate the Mobile Life Support contract as of 2/11/19. Seconded by Commissioner Post and carried. Vice-Chairman Shultis made a motion to engage EMSTAR in a contract for BLS and ALS services to begin 2/11/19. Seconded by Commissioner Post and carried.

On a motion by Commissioner Post and seconded by Vice-Chairman Shultis, \$60,000 will be transferred from the General Fund to the Reserve Fund for Major Equipment for the purchase of paying for the gear that was ordered in 2018, but not yet received. It is understood that a permissive referendum will need to be passed prior to the release of funds.

#### **NEW BUSINESS:**

Commissioner Post made a motion to authorize the Treasurer to schedule the 2018 Financial Audit. Seconded by Vice-Chairman Shultis and carried.

Commissioner Post made a motion to accept the 2018 Asset Listing as prepared by the Treasurer. Seconded by Vice-Chairman Shultis and carried.

On a motion by Commissioner Post and seconded by Vice-Chairman Shultis, up to 5 people are authorized to attend Turning Stone from 3/28 – 3/31/19.

On a motion by Commissioner Post and seconded by Vice-Chairman Shultis the NY Blood Center will be able to use the facility on 3/29 for their blood drive.

Commissioner Post made a motion to accept the 2019 activity list by Wiccopee Fire Company. Seconded by Vice-Chairman McNamara and carried.

Commissioner Post made a motion to allow 5 members to attend an ICS300 class in Orange County and to use the old 39-4 for transportation. Seconded by Vice-Chairman Shultis and carried.

Chairman McNamara stated the SAC meeting will be March 11, 2019 at 6:30 pm and notifications will be sent.

#### **DISTRICT CHIEF:**

Chief Geysen gave the report for the 2018 year end. There were 2,664 calls in 2018.

1<sup>st</sup> Assistant Chief Lacalamita gave his report for the 2018 year end. He stated he spoke with Kevin Jackson about where the new floor door will be installed in the training tower. There is a Firefighter 1 class here starting on February 19<sup>th</sup>.

Chief Gallo asked if the Auxiliary Mega Social could be put on the road sign. Secretary Beyer stated it is already there. Chief Gallo stated the substation is coming along. As soon as heat is going, they will be able to do the inside work. The doors should be installed next week. He asked questions regarding the Plymovent and Chairman McNamara suggested having their contractor contact Air Clean Systems directly.

Chief Glennon stated they have three community service inquiries. Commissioner Post stated the companies handle that directly.

Rescue Lt. O'Rourke stated there are four new members in the EMT class.

Motion to adjourn to Executive Session to discuss a personnel issue was made by Commissioner Post and seconded by Vice-Chairman Shultis at 8:26 PM.

Those members present for Executive Session were: Chairman McNamara, Vice-Chairman Shultis, and Commissioner Post, District Chief Geysen, First Assistant Chief Lacalamita, Secretary Beyer, Attorney MacLeod, and Firefighter 42. Commissioner Ehrhart and Commissioner Stuart were excused.

Motion to adjourn Executive Session and return to the regular meeting was made at 8:45 by Commissioner Post and seconded by Vice-Chairman Shultis.

There were no actions taken, but a letter regarding a suspended suspension will be placed in Firefighter 42's folder.

Motion to adjourn was made at 8:47 PM by Vice-Chairman Shultis and seconded by Commissioner Post.
