#### **MEETING OPENED:**

The East Fishkill Board of Fire Commissioners held their board meeting at district headquarters. Chairman Shultis called the meeting to order at 7:00 P.M.

## **MEMBERS PRESENT:**

Those members present were: Chairman Shultis, Vice-Chairman McNamara, Commissioner Ehrhart, Commissioner Post, and Commissioner Stuart.

All motions were unanimous, unless otherwise stated.

MOMENT OF SILENCE: For all fallen brothers and sisters in the military, police, and fire service.

#### PUBLIC HEARING:

A motion to open the public hearing for the 2018 budget was made by Vice-Chairman McNamara and seconded by Commissioner Stuart. Chairman Shultis advised those who attended that the Board did stay within the tax cap. He advised that the budget in 2018 will be \$3,257,289.00. There were no questions or comments from anyone regarding this proposed budget.

## ADJOURNMENT:

On a motion by Commissioner Ehrhart and seconded by Commissioner Post, adjournment of the 2018 public budget hearing was made at 7:15 pm.

## **PUBLIC HEARING:**

On a motion by Commissioner Ehrhart and seconded by Commissioner Post, the public hearing for the creation of a Special Tax Zone was opened at 7:16 PM.

Chairman Shultis stated a letter was received from the Town of East Fishkill, from Supervisor Hickman and it was read for the record.

Vice-Chairman McNamara stated that the Fire District has the ability to create a tax zone for specific parcels that may cause an increase in call volume or required equipment that would be unfair for the rest of the tax base to pay for. For that reason, the parcels for the Hopewell Sports Dome area and the newly subdivided land that was once IBM property are being considered for the Special Tax Zone. At this point in time, no additional tax will be assessed to these properties, as they are currently undeveloped and not causing any increase in call volume or equipment requirements. If that should become the case in the future, this Tax Zone will allow the district to provide for those issues without increasing the tax burden to the unaffected tax base.

John Jackson stated that the Fire Advisory Board did meet with the Town and the Commissioners back at the beginning of the project for the Dome and were told that the District didn't need anything from them. Vice-Chairman McNamara stated that at that time, the scope of the proposal was not what is being proposed now as far as the amount of events, time frame for hosting events, and additional development on the site. Mr. Jackson stated there are some issues with communication between the Town Board, Fire Commissioners and FAB and should be addressed. Commissioner Stuart stated that the Fire Commissioners have not signed off on projects during the SEQRA stages as part of the regular course of business. Dave Palin stated that the FAB makes recommendations, but doesn't find out if they've been taken into account until the end stages of a project, and by then it's too late to make changes. Mr. Jackson stated they have been told that as each parcel is proposed for development, it will come before the FAB

for comment. He asked what change would go into effect for these parcels at this time. Vice-Chairman McNamara stated that at this time, there is no proposed change as these are undeveloped parcels. It will be reviewed based on the usage of each site. It is not being set up as a Truck or Ladder District so it will not be limited to those options only.

John Paraskeva said that Four Corners and Hopewell Glen should have had this happen too. Chairman Shultis stated this is something that the Board learned about at their training in the spring and that it needs to happen during the construction phase of a project, not after the fact. Mr. Paraskeva thanked the Board for going this route and felt it was the right thing to do.

Steve Conti thanked the Board for thinking about the future in this matter.

Motion to adjourn this public hearing until 7:00 PM, October 18, due to an error in the public notices, was made at 7:40 by Vice-Chairman McNamara and seconded by Commissioner Ehrhart.

## **SECRETARY'S REPORT:**

The minutes of the September 27, 2017 meeting were accepted on a motion by Vice-Chairman McNamara and seconded by Commissioner Stuart. Motion carried.

Vice-Chairman McNamara made a motion to pass the resolution setting November 27 as the meeting for the Board of Elections to prepare the registration rolls, as attached to these minutes. Seconded by Commissioner Ehrhart and carried. On a motion by Vice-Chairman McNamara and seconded by Commissioner Post, the tax cap levy form as submitted by the Treasurer was approved. Vice Chairman McNamara made a motion to accept the 2018 Budget as proposed in the amount of

\$3,257,289.00 with \$3,245,048.00 to be raised by taxes. Seconded by Commissioner Ehrhart. Chairman Shultis asked that the Board be polled:

Motion carried. Commissioner Post made a motion to go out to bid for two 2018 Spartan Metro Star Engines per our specifications to be back by 3:00 PM on Wednesday, November 29, 2017 to be opened at the regular meeting scheduled for 8:00 PM that same night. Seconded by Vice-Chairman McNamara and carried. Commissioner Ehrhart made a motion to go out to bid for the paving of the existing black top area of the Fire Training Facility to be returned by 3:00 PM on November 13, to be opened at their meeting following the regularly scheduled workshop that night. Seconded by Commissioner Post and carried. Commissioner Ehrhart made a motion to authorize Shenandoah Contracting to build the pad for the future building site, with concessions for extra gravel if needed at \$13.00 per yard, at a base cost of \$15,600.00.

Vice-Chairman McNamara made a motion to allow 20 people to attend EMS Connection 11/11 at DCC \$45.00 each. Seconded by Commissioner Ehrhart and carried. On a motion by Vice-Chairman McNamara and seconded by Commissioner Ehrhart, up to 12 people are authorized attend a FP Seminar 11/11 at Highland FD \$8.00 each for lunch. Vice-Chairman McNamara made a motion allowing Stormville's Holiday Sale 11/18. Seconded by Commissioner Ehrhart and carried.
