

January 25, 2023

MEETING OPENED:

The East Fishkill Board of Fire Commissioners held their regular board meeting at headquarters. Chairman Shultis called the meeting to order at 8:00 P.M.

MEMBERS PRESENT:

Those members present were: Chairman Shultis, Vice-Chairman Dixon, Commissioner Ehrhart, Commissioner Jodlowski, and Commissioner Freer.

All motions were unanimous, unless otherwise stated.

MOMENT OF SILENCE: For all fallen brothers and sisters in the military, police, and fire and EMS service.

SECRETARY'S REPORT:

The minutes of the December 28, 2022 and January 9, 2023 meetings were accepted on a motion by Commissioner Jodlowski and seconded by Vice-Chairman Dixon. Motion carried.

TREASURER'S REPORT:

The Treasurer's Report for December 2022 was accepted on a motion by Vice-Chairman Dixon and seconded by Commissioner Jodlowski. Motion carried.

BILLS PAYABLE:

Commissioner Ehrhart made a motion that the bills from the General Fund totaling \$126,003.25, \$1,989.54 from the Reserve for B&L, and \$101,771.95 to be paid from the Reserve for Major Equipment, numbered 1 through 115 be approved. Seconded by Commissioner Jodlowski and carried.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

NEW BUSINESS:

Motion to approve up to six members to attend BEFO 2/27 in Putnam County at no cost was made by Commissioner Jodlowski and seconded by Vice-Chairman Dixon.

Vice-Chairman Dixon made a motion to purchase a new FIT tester from MES, in the amount not to exceed \$16,000.00. Seconded by Commissioner Jodlowski.

Commissioner Jodlowski made a motion to accept the purchase offer from Marlboro Fire Department for the unsold auction items at \$425.00. Seconded by Vice-Chairman Dixon.

District Chief Lacalamita had asked for the Board to host a class on electric vehicles taught by Fully Involved Training, at a cost of \$3,000.00 on March 18, to include lunch. This was approved on a motion by Vice-Chairman Dixon and seconded by Commissioner Jodlowski.

There is an Instructor II class at Montour Falls for 1 person, including meals & travel that was approved on a motion by Commissioner Jodlowski and seconded by Vice-Chairman Dixon.

On a motion by Vice-Chairman Dixon and seconded by Commissioner Dixon, up to 12 people have been authorized to attend a class in Westchester Co. for Truck Co. training at a cost of \$35.00 per person.

DISTRICT CHIEF: See report for December and year end as attached.

1. There has been a request from St. Aloysius for a Touch a Truck event on 1/31/2023. If there are any members available, it starts at 9:30. This was approved on a motion by Vice-Chairman Dixon and seconded by Commissioner Jodlowski.
2. Chief Lacalamita will be reviewing the policies as there are some conflicts with different ages. When he is done, he will submit them to the Board for review.
3. The 2023 gear order will be started soon.
4. Chief Lacalamita asked if the Board had any further discussion regarding removing some of the radios off of the trucks to give to interiors. Chairman Shultis stated the Board is agreeable to two radios coming off. All removed radios will be reprogrammed with all the same rules as the rest of the interior radios.

1st ASSISTANT CHIEF: See report for December as attached.

1. 175 people took the OSHA on January at HQ and the stations via zoom. It went very well. The changes made last year have been very beneficial and Chief Jackson thanked the Board for that. A lot of people have been taking state classes as well.
2. Chief Jackson asked if Commissioner Jodlowski had heard from Lion lately. Commissioner Jodlowski said no and they are still getting e-alerts for issues. The Lion rep is supposed to be checking with the programmers.

Assistant Chief Conti congratulated Chairman Shultis on his retirement from the DC Fire Advisory Board.

Assistant Chief Gallo congratulated Chairman Shultis on his retirement from the DC Fire Advisory Board.

Assistant Chief Kuhl thanked Chairman Shultis for his time on the DC Fire Advisory Board.

Assistant Chief Ryan thanked Chairman Chairman Shultis for his time on the DC Fire Advisory Board.

Captain Zboinski congratulated Chairman Shultis on his retirement from the DC Fire Advisory Board. Vice-Chairman Dixon stated he received a copy of the article written about the new FIU and posted it to the website. Captain Zboinski stated it was very well received throughout the state.

ADJOURNMENT:

Motion to adjourn to executive session to discuss the specific employment of one person was made at 8:20 PM by Vice-Chairman Dixon seconded by Commissioner Jodlowski.

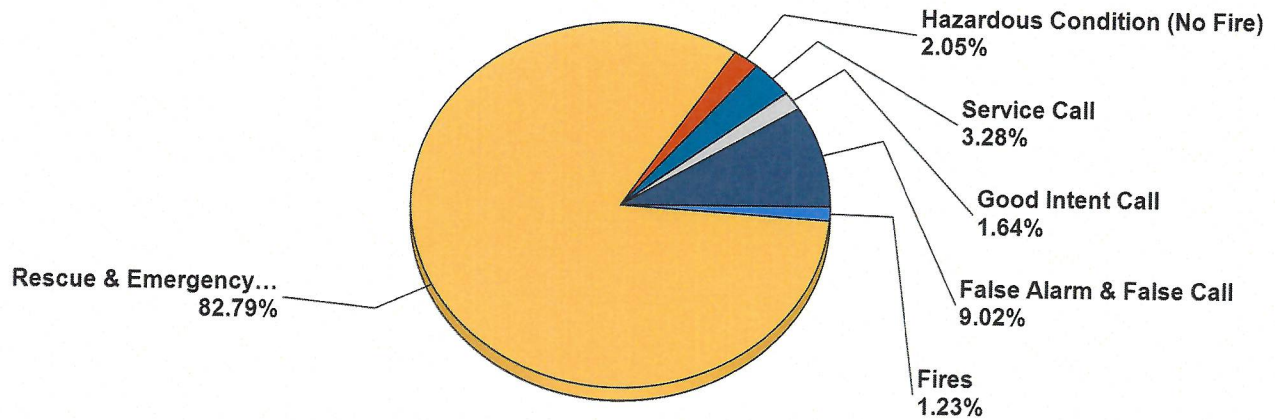

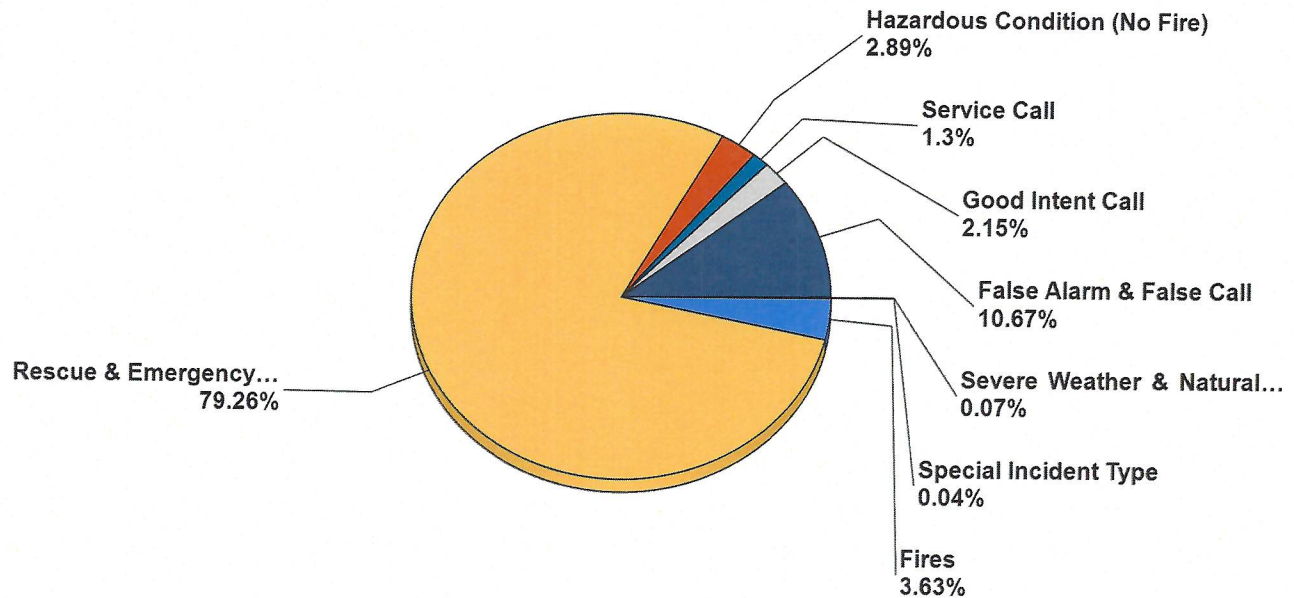
